Packages containing all the things they did not have, toys, candy, warm hats and mittens. She remembers thinking how amazing it was that strangers in America, who didn't even know her, sent her these wonderful things.

Now Gisela lives a comfortable life in Oslo, Norway. She has visited Sonoma County twice, and even came with us to the Freya Lodge 17. mai celebration in 2016.

When she saw the news reports on TV in Norway about the devastating wildfires here, her heart went out to all those families who lost their homes and belongings in the fire. She especially felt sad for all the children who had to go through such a traumatic time.

It made her think of the hardships of her own childhood and how much she appreciated receiving packages from America. She decided this was an opportunity for her to return the kindness.

She forwarded a generous donation to Freya Lodge in order that I might replace some of the favorite things kids lost in the fires. With the help of Freya Lodge member Valerie Box, whose family was one of those who lost everything, we easily rounded up a group of kids. After a fabulous shopping spree we were able to give these boys and girls back some of the things they had lost, along with a snuggly blanket or stuffed animal for comfort.

This was thanks to a very special lady who knows from experience how wonderful it is to be given a gift of love from a stranger.

#### Sour Cream Porridge (Rømmegrøt)

From Sons of Norway Newsletter Service

4 dl (1 2/3 cups) 35% fat sour cream About 3 dl (1¼ cups) flour About 1¼ liters (5 cups) full fat milk ¾ tsp salt

Sour cream porridge must be made from high fat (35%) natural sour cream, with no stabilizers or gelatin added. For the best results, use homemade sour cream. Heat 2 1/2 dl (1 cup) whipping cream to 35° C (95° F), almost body temperature, then whisk in 2 tablespoons buttermilk. Let stand at room temperature at least 8 hours, until thickened.

Simmer sour cream, covered, about 15 minutes.

Sift over 1/3 of the flour. Simmer until the butterfat begins to separate out. Skim off the fat.

Sift over the remaining flour and bring to a boil. Bring the milk to a boil and thin the porridge to desired consistency. Whisk until smooth. Simmer about 10 minutes, and season with salt. Serve with the skimmed butterfat, sugar and cinnamon.
